How Does the Idea of Vocation Matter Today?

In Luther's day, the church taught that being a called clergy person was religiously and morally more significant than being a lay person. If you wanted to be as close as possible to God, you had to enter a religious vocation. Luther protested this idea. Instead he taught that every Christian, from ordained priest to stable worker, is called by God to their vocations, and that all of these vocations are equally significant to God. This teaching unleashed unprecedented energy for worldly work in the Western world. But that was 500 years ago – does this idea matter today? HomePlate holds 3 drop-in evenings every week, 52 weeks a year, plus afternoon drop-in in Beaverton – that is 156 dinners a year. The youth at HomePlate love the lasagna, mac and cheese, and PBJ sandwiches that PoP serves on the third Wednesday of every month. They also appreciate the consistency of how our volunteers help with homework, sit and talk, play basketball, or provide a caring ear during the evening. But wait, there's more – HomePlate also runs the Youth Employment Program, street outreach, and the Community Connections program. Watch this space for more details on each of those in future week.
